

Unfortunately, I missed the talk on July 22<sup>nd</sup> by Astronomer Dennis Ashton and thanks to Trish for stepping up and chairing the meeting. I've heard Dennis several times before and I know he's an excellent speaker and I'm sure you were all well entertained.

July 29<sup>th</sup> and I'm preparing now for tonight's full business meeting and looking forward to welcoming back ex-Rotarian Terry Moore who is over from Florida with his wife for a visit.

Points to Note

There were seventeen members present, and seventeen apologies. By some kind of miracle, everyone who was supposed to be there (ie had not apologised) was actually in attendance. Long may it remain.

The Club were joined by former Rotarian Terry Moore, who now lives in Florida, and his wife Tanya, catching up with friends and family in the UK

The Club's revised constitution, the subject of some debate over recent weeks, had been circulated, together with the RGB&I Dispute Management Procedures Guidance. It was proposed that the Constitution be adopted in its present form, and all members present voted in favour, with no absentions.

Committee chairs presented reports to the Club, and feedback from points for discussion. The general consensus regarding the approach to members retiring from the Club should be dealt with on a case by case basis, and that no formal procedure should be adopted.

#### Club Service

After reflection on the possibility of the Club helping with gardening at Rotherham Hospice, it was suggested that the Club provide funds to pay for a gardener rather than provide the labour. Please consider this with your committees.


